Route 12 Rental Co and Route 12 Arctic Cat have become a trusted name in truck, trailer and equipment rentals and recreational sporting equipment in the Arlington Heights area for decades. Route 12 Rental Co was established in 1963. This family-owned and operated business started out as a rental company, offering a large selection of tools, trucks, trailers, equipment rentals and more. The business even had a small engine repair shop. Since opening its doors, the business was well-received but found the winter months to be slower. It was these slower months that prompted owner, Bill Simon, along with his employee Bruce Koop, to start selling snowmobiles. Illinois Snowmobiler had a chance to sit down with both partners to discuss Route 12, its history, accomplishments and future plans.



Bruce Koop caught the snowmobiling bug early. In fact, he was just 8 years old when his grandfather got him his first 10 horsepower snowmobile. "It was a little guy," Bruce quipped. Bill began working at Route 12 Rental straight out of high school. He has been a member of several snowmobile clubs over the years. Currently, he's a member of the Richmond Trailblazers and involved in organized snowmobiling.

As an equipment, truck, and trailer business, Route 12 Rental was doing well, but it seemed like there was more potential. The winter months were always a bit slower and since they were already selling snowmobiles, another branch of Route 12 was formed in 1984 in its own building. Owner Bill Simon explains, "In 1984, we had the equipment rental store. Many of our employees were avid snowmobilers, and we decided we all wanted to sell snowmobiles. So we contacted Arctic Cat and they told us if we bought 6 snowmobiles, we could become a dealer. So that's what we did."

Route 12 Arctic Cat provides sales and service on Arctic Cat snowmobiles, ATVs, and side by sides. In 2017, they picked up the CF MOTO off road vehicle line, and they offer sales and service on the



CF MOTO ATVs, side by sides and utility vehicles. Route 12 Arctic Cat has a full inventory of clothing and accessories including Arctic Cat, FXR, Fly Racing, HJC, Castle X gear, helmets, accessories, boots, gloves and everything you need to keep you warm while you ride. Route 12 Arctic Cat also has aftermarket parts and a full service repair shop. "Anything from an oil change to an engine rebuild and

everything in between," Bill explains.

It comes as no surprise that Route 12 has remained popular within the organized snowmobiling community. They are 2-time winners of the IASC's coveted Dealer of the Year award. Prior to the pandemic, Route 12 Arctic Cat hosted annual open houses. "We'd have a pretty good turnout. People get together with other snowmobilers," Bruce explains. "Customers really look forward to them," Bill adds.

As Bruce and Bill mull retirement, the business will be in good hands whenever that day comes. Bill Jr. has been involved in the business since the age of 14. "My son John is managing the equipment, truck, and trailer rental part of the business," Bill continued. Route 12 Arctic Cats' main mechanic, Jim Kulling, has been working at Route 12 for roughly 20 years. "Both of these businesses have been blessed with great long term employees, and we couldn't be where we are today without them." Future plans for Bruce include spending time with family up in their cabin right on Lake Superior. "I'd like to do a little more snowmobiling, hunting and fishing. Run around with some of my guys that race high performance stuff and do a little more on the race circuit," Bruce details. As for Bill, "My better half would love to see us move down to Florida! It's been a good ride. I've enjoyed my business."

Congratulations to Bruce and Bill and all who contribute to the success of Route 12. Your commitment to the sport of snowmobiling hasn't gone unnoticed and we look forward to future achievements.

### **MANISTEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN**

Lower Michigan's "snow coast" includes numerous counties along Lake Michigan's eastern shore where prevailing winds bring lake effect snow to supplement other winter snowfalls. Manistee County, two-thirds of the way up the coast, is amidst this happy place, with a nice trail system that features plenty of scenic splendor. There are numerous loop routes of varying distance that will easily keep riders busy for two or three days, as well as routes that connect north to Traverse City, east to Cadillac and south to White Cloud, where more trails await.

### LA CROSSE COUNTY, WISCONSIN

When a place is known as "God's Country," it's obviously something special. La Crosse County, located along the Mississippi River on Wisconsin's western border, is within the fabled "Driftless Area" untouched by Ice Age glaciation. Riding here is a real treat with scenic vistas galore and lots of hills, valleys, rolling farmland and coulees to keep it interesting and fun. The Great River and La Crosse River State Trails connect at Onalaska and offer miles of smooth cruising to the northwest and to the east, providing easy access to other routes. La Crosse County is bisected by Interstate 90, making it eminently accessible from east or west.

### CRATER LAKE, OREGON

Crater Lake is one of the greatest geologic marvels in North America, as well as the most spectacular sight in the Cascade Mountain Range, which runs the length of Oregon from the Columbia River to the California border. The deep blue lake which is 5 miles across and 1,900' deep (deepest in the U.S.) is within the caldera of a collapsed volcano and even includes an island! Although Crater Lake National Park is closed in winter and otherwise off limits to snowmobilers, sledders can reach the lake after an eight mile ride over the groomed North Access Road, which leads to an overlook point on the caldera rim.



Well, here we are at the end of another summer getting for our ready favorite season. As I am writing this, we are just getting out of an unbelievable stretch of hot and humid weather. That makes me think about cold weather and snow

that much more. I see some leaves are already starting to turn, so that is a good sign that fall is right around the corner. Drier air, cooler daytime temps and those beautiful crisp, clear mornings really make you think about winter's arrival.

If you are a snowmobile safety instructor, you are probably already making plans for this year's safety class(es). That includes getting a location reserved, materials lined up, and flyers made up, etc. While the online numbers keep creeping up, I still feel that we, as experienced riders, are still the best option for educating our snowmobiling youth. We have that real world experience we can share that just can't be replicated by a student sitting at a computer reading some text on a screen. I keep hoping instructor-taught classes will make the turn and catch up to the

online classes one day. If we could only get Illinois to make instructor-taught classes mandatory for those under 16, I think it would be beneficial for all. I haven't given up on that dream yet.

Please keep in mind that these classes are not only for kids. Wisconsin requires anyone born after 1985 to be in possession of a snowmobile safety certification. That is a 38-39 year old individual! So, if you know someone who is just entering the sport, make sure they are aware of these requirements. Neighboring states do honor Illinois' safety certifications; if you have taken the class in Illinois, you are good to go in Minnesota, Michigan, Wisconsin, and others. Wisconsin's pre-'85 deal is still a requirement, regardless of what state you are from. And remember to keep that pink certificate handy. Failure to provide proof of certification is a ticketable offense. The classes are also required to operate a snowmobile if you have lost your automotive driver's license for whatever reason, so there's that.

As a parent, you should also be aware that you are most welcome to stay at the class location and take the course with your son or daughter. In fact, most instructors prefer that you do take the class. I can almost guarantee you will pick up something new that you weren't aware of before no matter how long you have been riding. There's one last item I want to cover since I am referring

to parents taking the class. Over the years since I have become an instructor, I've always taken the time to read DNR snowmobile incident reports from Illinois and surrounding states. The majority of folks involved in accidents are not the kids, but us adults. And what are some of the most common reasons for accidents in our age group, you ask? Driving too fast for conditions and alcohol/impaired operation. Think about it folks, we're supposed to be setting the example for these students. So with fall just around the corner and us thinking about sledding, think about snowmobile safety as well. We all have a lot of reasons to make it back from the ride in one piece. Ride safe, folks.
